Connecting Generations through Trishaw Rides

A fun intergenerational activity was successfully conducted together with Cycling Without Age and MINDS's Me Too Club. Close to 20 residents from Ren Ci @ Ang Mo Kio Nursing Home took rides together with the beneficiaries from MINDS around Bishan Park on a Denmark-made trishaw.

Volunteers from Cycling Without Age steered the trishaws which are specially designed for easy access by both elderly and persons with disabilities and yet nimble enough to navigate through small spaces. Throughout the curated rides to the park, our residents took the opportunity to chitchat with the students and their conversation morphed into laughter during the leisure journey. The ride on the trishaw helps the seniors to relive the memories of the past while the youths embrace a refreshing experience of bonding with the Pioneer and Merdeka Generations.

Cycling Without Age is a movement which originated in Denmark that offers free bike rides while Me Too Club programme aims to enhance the social integration of adults with intellectual disabilities. This innovative initiative is made possible under Moving Generations Programme, funded by Temasek Foundation Cares.

The WLTD Programme is a formal apprenticeship-based training arrangement targeted at ITE graduates with Nitec or Higher Nitec qualifications.

Facing an ageing population where demand in community rehabilitative care is expected to grow, it is important to offer realistic training and mentorship so as to ensure a skilled workforce and to encourage more to join our community care sector. Ren Ci hopes to share our expertise with incumbent students and will send our own existing care staff to upgrade their skills and knowledge through this technical diploma. Camp Reconnection has moved into its fifth year bridging connections between generations. Beside retaining staple activities like experiential learning and dialect lessons, this year's theme Back In The Day sought to bring youth participants and seniors together on memory lane.

Some 40 youths from junior colleges and polytechnics participated in the 4-day event. Melanie Chng, 20, who have volunteered in more than two editions said that the Camp is an enriching platform for the young to get to know the seniors and understand their challenges so that she can relate better with her grandparents at home.

A storybook depicting the life stories of our seniors is currently in the works. The book is the concluding "homework" from the participants and their tribute towards the contributions our residents have gifted during their prime years.

The annual camp is a collaboration between Ren Ci Hospital and National University of Singapore University Scholars' Club. More than 160 youths aged between 16 - 19 have passed through this camp.

Falls Prevention Programme to Help Seniors

Close to 70% of falls in seniors happen within their households and health conditions and age related physical changes like decreasing muscle strength and balance are some of the common causes.

As Ren Ci promotes seniors to age in the community, it is important for them to be equipped with adequate information on identifying fall hazards and the right recovery techniques in the event of falls. A pilot programme was initiated by Ren Ci in collaboration with Teck Ghee Zone 'A' Residents' Committee (RC) to address these concerns.

The 13 sessions led by Ren Ci's therapists teach physical exercises and education on topics like home and community safety and fall recovery. Participants are identified by the RC during their regular house visits. Thus far, 11 seniors have benefitted from the programme. Mdm Lai Ah Moey, 75, said that the programme gave her useful information on fall prevention and she intends to share it with her friends.

Head of Ren Ci's Rehabilitation Department, Ms Ng Lip Chin believes that the customised programme will strengthen the seniors' physical condition and help them mitigate potential risks, increase their knowledge on falls prevention and empower them to make appropriate decisions in their daily activities to prevent falls.

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预防跌倒课程帮助年长者

近70%的跌倒事故发生在年长者家中。因健康状况和年龄相关的身体变化,如 肌肉力量和平衡能力减缓是导致意外发生的一些常见原因。

仁慈为促进年长者在社区中原地养老的当儿,让年长者们握有相关的认知能力如 识别危险处及正确的恢复技术是非常重要。因此仁慈医院宏茂桥疗养院与德义A 区居民委员会合作,开办课程授予年长者。

由仁慈复健师指导的13个课程讲授家庭安全,社区安全和跌倒康复等主题的体 育锻炼和教育。参加者由居民委员会在进行常规家访期间确定。截至目前为止, 已有11名年长者从课程中受益。现年75岁的赖亚妹女士说,该计划让她更深入 了解跌倒预防技术,并打算与朋友分享。

仁慈复健部主任黄立菁小姐认为定制课程将加强老年人的身体状况,帮助他们减 少潜在风险,增加他们对跌倒预防的知识,并使他们能够在日常活动中做出适当 的决定,以防止跌倒。
